COURSE GOALS:

- To manage time, resources, and media to independently create artworks based on personally meaningful themes.
- To continue to experiment, practice, and persist in order to demonstrate mastery of painting skills.
- To engage in constructive critique with peers, then reflect, revise, and refine works.
- To make independent, artistic choices without relying on instructor to define criteria, media, procedure, etc.

SUPPLY LIST:

RULES:
