
- *I asked you to watch “Dakar: From Junk to Art” and complete the google form video guide.*

# #1 – Magazine Bowl


This is what we typically create in class together!

# Supplies:

*All supplies may be available at home OR on the cart outside my classroom:*

1. Magazines
2. Scissors
3. Elmer's Glue (bottle, not stick)
4. Paper Clip
5. Mod Podge (optional)



# *“Grading” & Due Date*

*I do not have formal criteria for you but here are some things to think about:*

1. Consider making your form a shape (heart, star, vase, bird, etc.)
2. Easy on the glue! It’s really easy for these to get messy if you’re not careful
3. Consider making your form 3-5 inches in the longest direction.
4. If you have Mod Podge at home, use a brush to cover the entire thing with a thin layer after you are finished to make it sturdier.
